Infrastructure Assets (CIPFA Bulletin 12)

The final version of CIPFA Bulletin 12 was issued on 11 January, setting out the key details of both elements of the temporary solution for infrastructure assets.

The bulletin sets out the background to the issues raised, guidance on the Update to the Code (published in November 2022) and interaction of the Code Update with statutory prescriptions for England and Wales.

It also includes illustrations of mechanisms to deal with depreciation, setting out ranges of useful lives deemed to be reasonable by highways experts. The Bulletin also features accounting policy examples and an example format for the amended disclosures for infrastructure assets. The <u>Bulletin</u> is available on the CIPFA website. FAN 2022/23 Accounts Closedown and Financial Reporting Series

As mentioned in the advisor update above, the FAN 2022/23 Accounts Closedown series is now underway and remaining events are selling out fast. Details of the available dates are set out in the event listing. The series is taking place via Zoom webinars (MS Teams being used for the police-specific event). The series finishes on 16 February so book your places now so you don't miss out.

Completing and Accounting for the NNDR 3 2022/23

Following the success of these events in previous years, this joint series allows the opportunity for revenues and accounting delegates to work together and consider their respective and combined roles and responsibilities in completing the NNDR 3 2022/23 form and the subsequent accounting implications.

The programme for the day will be led by CBRS Lead Revenue Advisor Adrian Blaylock and FAN advisor Mark Catlow. The event is structured around the sections of the NNDR 3 form, how these should be completed and what the accounting implications are of each section. It will then consider the remaining implications for finalising the NNDR 3 entries such as the collection fund surplus/deficit, S31 grants, safety net and levy calculations.

These events are aimed at revenues and accounting practitioners who will be involved in any or all the completion of the NNDR 3 2022/23, the production of the collection fund for business rates, and the subsequent general fund accounting. If you are new to the NNDR 3 or require a refresher, then this is for you.

Understanding and Using CIPFA's Collection Fund Accounting Models

FAN developed the spreadsheet Collection Fund Accounting Models as key tools in giving authorities (and their auditors) assurance on year-end accounting transactions and treatment of Council Tax and Business Rates. Many external auditors consider the models good practice.

In March we are running some events on 'Understanding and Using the FAN Collection Fund Accounting Models' which are designed to assist those authorities choosing to use them. These events will guide you through completing the models and understanding the mechanics of how they work, and what they produce, to maximise their benefit, not only as a closedown tool (bearing in mind quicker closedown) but also in financial planning.

During this series we aim to do just that, using worked examples to walk step-by-step through both the Council Tax and NDR Models, led by FAN advisor Mark Catlow. The events also cover the functionality of the models in relation to pooling (for the pool lead in calculating pool benefit). For more details and to book places see the event listing.

Whole of Government Accounts (WGA) Update

HM Treasury have just confirmed that the 2021/22 Data Collection Tool (DCT) is now available, with <u>quidance</u> available online.

Many of the queries received by the WGA team to date are covered by the preparer guidance. HM Treasury politely request that practitioners check the guidance first before contacting them to ensure that issues are resolved more promptly overall. Submission deadlines are set out below:

- Cycle 1 DCT submission deadline 28 February 2023
- Cycle 2 DCT submission deadline 31 March 2023

Update to the IFS-CIPFA local government finance model

The IFS-CIPFA Local Government Finance model is an interactive, web-based tool which allows councils in England to look at a range of scenarios for future revenues, spending needs and the local government funding system, to aid with their medium- to longer-term planning and engagement with system reform.

It has recently been updated to reflect the provisional settlement for 2023/24, known grants in 2024/25 and some new features have been added based on feedback from authorities already using the model. This includes the ability to download results for groups of Councils (by type, region or all Councils in England). For more details see the <u>CIPFA website page</u>.

NAO Progress Update - Timeliness of local auditor reporting on local government in England

The latest report from the National Audit Office examines the progress made in improving the timeliness of auditor reporting on English local public bodies' financial statements. Delays in completing audited accounts can have significant implications for local accountability and the effective management of public money. Integrating Care
